Itinerary...

Wednesday 16 August Arrive Zagreb

On arrival, you should make your way to the Palace Hotel for a stay of 2 nights. (B)

Thursday 17 August

Morning sightseeing tour of Zagreb, visiting the fortified Upper Town, the city's historical centre, St Marks Church, City Museum and Cathedral. Remainder of day free to enjoy Zagreb's cosmopolitan lifestyle. (B)

Friday 18 August Zagreb to Rijeka (by road – 130kms)

Late this morning, we transfer by coach to the coastal city of Rijeka where we embark on the MV Emanuel – our home for the next 13 nights. This evening, we'll enjoy a short sightseeing tour before settling in. (B/D)

Saturday 19 August Sightseeing Istria to Opatija

This morning we travel by coach to the ancient town of Pula where we visit one of the best preserved amphitheatres in the world and other Roman ruins. Lunch will be taken at a traditional family venue and will include a folkloric performance by local musicians and dancers. After lunch we proceed to Opatija to rejoin MV Emmanuel. Situated below a mountain and a nature park, Opatija features old Austrian villas, beaches and a magnificent seaside promenade and is one of the leading tourist destinations in Croatia.

Sunday 20 August Sailing from Opatija to Krk

Leaving Opatija early morning we sail to the island of Krk, the largest island in Croatia. On arrival we'll take a wine tour to the village of Vrbnik. This quaint, almost medieval village is perched on a high cliff overlooking the sea. Upon return from our wine tour we sail for the island of Rab arriving mid-afternoon. Rab is one of the greenest islands in the Adriatic and probably one of the most magical. It is covered with pine forests and has beautiful beaches and is well known for its mild climate which differs from the mainland. The main resort, Rab town, is full of medieval buildings, built during the Venetian rule, dating back to the 13th century, the old town walls are still visible in some places. You will have free time to amble around and explore this particularly beautiful town.

Monday 21 August Sailing from Rab to Zadar

Early this morning we set sail for the coastal port of Zadar, an ancient Roman colony and in medieval times a rival to Venice. Along the way we will have an opportunity for a swim on the island of Pag or Vir before arriving at Zadar in mid-afternoon. This evening you may wish to stroll along the Riva and visit the Sea Organ and nearby Greetings to the Sun.

Tuesday 22 August Sightseeing Zadar then sail to the Kornati Islands.

This morning, we enjoy a 2 hour walking tour, including a stroll along the famous Kalelarga Street. We then set sail for the Kornati Islands National Park where we'll experience magnificent views of 140 islands and islets of exceptional beauty, as well as small fishing villages and picturesque shorelines.

Wednesday 23 August Sail to Sibenik

Early this morning we set sail for Skradin, travelling approximately 12kms up-river, through fascinating gorges, to visit the magnificent Krka waterfalls. This afternoon, we journey to Sibenik where we stroll through the heart of the ancient town.

Thursday 24 August Trogir and Solta

This morning, we set sail for Trogir, known as a "city museum" and listed in UNESCO's world heritage list. We take a 1 hour walking tour to breathe in the feeling of antiquity which abounds in this lovely town. After lunch, we set sail for the port of Stomorska on the island of Solta with a stop for swimming along the way. Upon arrival there is free time for you to explore this unique port located in a cradle between pine forests and olive groves.

Friday 25 August Solta to Omis

After breakfast this morning we sail towards the Dalmatian coastal town of Omis situated in the mouth of the Cetina River and surrounded by massive gorges. In the past Omis was notorious because of the pirates of Omis whose ships were a centuries-long symbol of retaliation, courage and strength. After dinner this evening we'll be serenaded by a group of local musicians.

Saturday 26 August Omis to Pucisca

After breakfast this morning we take a local boat ride through the Cetina river canyon to Radman's mills. Upon return to Omis we sail for Pucisca on the island of Brač. Pucisca is famous for its white stone - used for centuries in palaces and cathedrals and, most notably, the USA's White House. We will have an opportunity for a swim before visiting a masonry school, one of the few remaining such schools in Europe.

Sunday 27 August Sail to Hvar

After breakfast, we set sail to Bol where we visit Zlatni Rat (one of the most beautiful beaches on the Adriatic coast). There will be an opportunity to explore Bol, or to take the mini train to the famous beach for a swim. After lunch, we cruise to Hvar Island. The harbour is small and extremely busy so, this afternoon, we anchor just outside the entrance then transfer by local boat to undertake a short stroll along Hvar's waterfront promenade and through the Old Town's historic medieval and Renaissance heart. This evening, we dine ashore at the famous Divno Restaurant and with free time prior to being transferred back to our vessel at 10pm.

Monday 28 August Sail to Vis

Early this morning, we depart for the island of Vis. During WWII, Vis was Tito's headquarters, regularly visited by Churchill's intelligence officers who assisted with his fight against the German invaders. Later this morning we visit the cave from which Tito directed his forces, the British wartime airport and a local winery.

Tuesday 29 August Vis to Korcula

This morning, we set sail for the island of Korcula, reputed to be the birthplace of Marco Polo. Korcula town, another ancient walled city, contains a wealth of artistic masterworks including paintings by Tintoretto. This afternoon we take a short guided walking tour after which we have free time to enjoy this unique town. This evening we will be serenaded at dinner by local acapelo musicians.

Wednesday 30 August Sail to Dubrovnik

This morning we head towards the Pelješac peninsula and the small town of Trstenik where we'll have a wine tasting at the Grgic winery, made famous by Mike Grgic of Napa Valley fame. After which we depart for a quiet bay in the Elafiti islands where we enjoy a relaxing swim before sailing into Dubrovnik – the "Pearl of the Adriatic." Dubrovnik is a breathtaking sight, entirely surrounded by massive grey walls, interspersed with 4 gates, 3 forts, 5 bastions and 14 towers. Our ship will take us on a panoramic view of these majestic walls before heading for port. This evening we join the skipper and crew for a special farewell dinner on board.

Thursday 31 August Disembark at Dubrovnik

After breakfast we bid farewell to our boat and crew and join our coach and guide for a tour to a viewpoint overlooking the old city and visit the resort town of Cavtat prior to transfer to Hotel Grand Park [or similar] for a 3 night stay. (B) Later this afternoon our coach will then take us to Pile Gate where we will start our walking tour along the famous Stradun visiting Dubrovnik's highlights such as the Franciscan Monastery with one of the oldest pharmacies in Europe, the Rector's Palace and the Cathedral.

Friday 01 September Dubrovnik

Free day to enjoy the sights of Dubrovnik. (B)

Sunday 03 September Dubrovnik to Split

After breakfast we depart Dubrovnik and travel by coach along the scenic Adriatic highway to Split – Croatia's second largest city - with en route stop at Makarska. Accommodation at the Park Hotel [or similar] for a 2 night stay (B).

Monday 04 September Split

This morning we join a sightseeing tour of Split featuring the Diocletian Palace [a World Heritage Site], Jupiter's Temple, the Cathedral and the famous Split markets. (B)

Tuesday 05 September Split to Plitvice

Depart Split by coach for Plitvice Lakes travelling the inland route through scenic rural countryside. Accommodation is at the Hotel Jezero for 2 nights (B)

Wednesday 06 September Plitvice Lakes

Today we enjoy a walking tour of the Plitvice Lakes National Park. These UNESCO World Heritage Lakes are a natural phenomenon of rare and unique beauty. They comprise 16 lakes each of which is at a different level and joined by a series of cascading waterfalls. (B)

Thursday 07 September Plitvice to Zagreb Airport

Depart Plitvice for Zagreb Airport where your tour ends.
